



## **Pupil Premium**

Pupil Premium is an additional amount of funding which the Government believes should help schools to meet the needs of children of low income families. The fund is allocated to pupils who are currently known to be eligible for FSM (Free School Meals) and for children who have been 'Looked After' for more than six months.

At Rood End we have spent and allocated the money in a variety of ways to ensure that all our Pupil Premium pupils have the resources to make progress through quality learning experiences. We have also included support for parents so that they can help their children succeed.

## Impact of funding for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium 2019 – 2020

Due to the COVID-19 National Lockdown, there is no summative data for either Key Stage for the 2019-2020 academic year.

In December 2020, Year 2 pupils sat their Phonics Screening assessment. This test data has been included.

### Progress from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2:

For Pupil Premium pupils, progress rates were +4.68 in reading, +4.87 in writing and +5.87 in maths. Nationally, this is in the top quartile of schools.

Nationally, in 2019, 65% of all Year Six pupils achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined. For our Pupil Premium pupils, the school has now narrowed this gap to 2%.
