

Sports Pupil Premium – Impact of funding 2016/2017

Pupil Premium is an additional amount of funding which the Government believes should help schools to meet the needs of children of low income families. The fund is allocated to pupils who are currently known to be eligible for FSM (Free School Meals) and for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months.

We have spent and allocated money in a variety of ways to ensure that all our Pupil Premium pupils have the resources to make progress through a variety of physical activities and experiences.
